ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION:

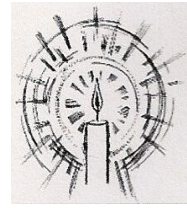
My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

JULY - MONTH OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Saviour shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it.

ST PATRICK'S CHURCH REOPENING Churches have been given permission to open for Masses provided they can comply with all safety and COVID secure measures. St Patrick's is now open for Public Mass at the usual times. During Mass there is no Sign of Peace and parishioners are asked to follow all instructions from the stewards and to read notices carefully. **Face coverings are required, so please bring one to the church with you.** Please arrive in good time for Mass in order to comply with all the Covid safety rules. It is important to reaffirm that, at present, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended. Given there is no Sunday obligation, we ask you to consider the possibility of attending Mass on a weekday. This will ease the pressure of numbers for Sunday celebrations and allow a gradual return to the Eucharist for more people. Many thanks to all who have volunteered to make this possible.

STEWARDS/CLEANERS To comply with the national/diocesan guidelines for reopening places of worship for public services we need stewards and those who will help sanitise the Church during the week and particularly on Sundays. We need 3 stewards on Sundays and 2 weekdays. Please speak to us if you are willing to help. Thank you.

A BIG THANK YOU to all Parishioners for their support shown, in many different ways, to our Church and Community during the lock-down. Thank you to those who donated on-line via diocesan website (<https://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/support-our-work>), sent cheques, set up standing orders and brought weekly collection to the Presbytery. As we are not allowed to pass collection bags during Mass, there will be a collection plate, on your way in and out of the Church.

THERE IS STILL NO OBLIGATION FOR PEOPLE TO ATTEND MASS ON SUNDAYS You can choose any day of the week and the Bishops fully encourage you to continue praying the Mass by watching it online. If you are in the extremely vulnerable category of shielding or have received specific personal instructions from the Government not to attend religious services then you must not attend. However, parishioners who are over 70 or have underlying health conditions may now volunteer as a steward or cleaner. It is a matter for the individual to make an informed decision as to whether they apply. No one should feel pressured into doing so.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. MARY MAGDALENE was one of the few who witnessed Christ's Crucifixion. She was in the group of women who were the first to discover the empty tomb and it was to her that the risen Jesus first appeared. The Western tradition is that Mary Magdalene is also "the woman who was a sinner" and the sister of Martha and Lazarus of Bethany. Mary Magdalene is a unique and important character in the story of the Resurrection, chosen by Christ as one of the first witnesses of the event that changed the world.
