ATTENDENCE AT HOLY MASS AT ST PATRICK'S Due to the current pandemic situation, there are many requirements for the resumption of public worship, many of which may seem rather tiresome, but without which we would not be allowed to resume:

- Holy Water stoups are empty.
- People must provide **face coverings** which **must be worn**.
- **Please arrive in good time**, to minimise queuing outside the church; you will be shown to a seat by one of the stewards .
- Enter by the ramp door. A one-way system will be in place in church.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry.
- Please follow the directions given by the stewards who will show you to your seat by going towards the altar down the central aisle.
- Due to social distancing requirements, there is a reduced capacity which is 65. (However, **members of a household/"bubble" may sit together**, and thereby the capacity increases significantly)
- There will be no congregational singing, and no singing by choir,
- Offertory collections: a collection plate or basket will be on your way in and out of the Church, so you can leave your offerings as you enter the church. (No offertory collection during the Mass).
- People are encouraged to bring their own Missals/tablets to follow the order of Mass. Any printed newsletters should be taken home because they cannot be re-used.
- **Holy Communion** will be distributed after Holy Mass has been completed. People should queue for Holy Communion in a socially distanced manner, approaching the Altar along the central aisle and in single file. Only the priest will distribute Holy Communion.
- Face coverings/masks should be removed to receive Holy Communion and then replaced immediately.
- People should then proceed down to the exit, and leave via the side door in the chapel.
- There will be no toilet facilities available.
- Churches must be sanitised after each celebration of Holy Mass.
- Those who are showing possible symptoms of coronavirus or other illness should not attend.



THERE IS STILL NO OBLIGATION FOR PEOPLE TO ATTEND MASS ON SUNDAYS Given there is no Sunday obligation, we ask you to consider the possibility of attending Mass on a weekday. This will ease the pressure of numbers for Sunday celebrations and allow a gradual return to the Eucharist for more people.

THE GIFT AID ENVELOPES for the tax year 2020/2021 are available. They can be collected after Masses. **ARE YOU A UK TAXPAYER?** If you are not already a gift aider and would be prepared to help the parish in this special way and at no extra cost to yourself please speak to Mavis.

THANK YOU TO ALL STEWARDS who are assisting us according to government guidelines to enable us to celebrate Holy Mass and have the church open to the public; indeed, without the stewards on duty, we are not permitted to open the churches. Meanwhile, we need to be thankful that our churches are open for Holy Mass, even if we would prefer not to have to put up with various safety measures imposed on us.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST CORNELIUS AND ST CYPRIAN (Wednesday) were martyrs of the early Church. Cornelius was Pope, and he taught Catholic doctrine against the Novatian heresy, one of the many heresies in the early Church. He was exiled from Rome, and died as a result, and so is counted among the martyrs. St. Cyprian was Bishop of Carthage in North Africa, and was a strong supporter of Cornelius. Cornelius died in 253AD, and Cyprian was beheaded during the persecutions of the Emperor Valerian.
