Following on from the Rosary on the Coast last April, Bishop John Keenan is appealing for Catholics to join again in praying the Rosary with an Act of National Reparation. We will gather in the silence of Mary and kneel under the Cross - and with Mary embrace the Cross of Christ in our times and plead for God's Mercy. "When people say the Rosary together it is far more formidable to the Devil than one said privately, because in this public prayer it is an army that is attacking. It is easy to break a single stick, but if you join it to others in a bundle, it

cannot be broken. In union, there is strength."

CONCERNING THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION IN THE HAND The have been a couple of unfortunate incidents during the administration of Holy Communion during Holy Mass recently. It should be remembered that the normative manner in which Holy Communion is to be received in the Western Rite is on the tongue, though permission has been granted in some areas of the world for the faithful to receive Holy Communion in the hand (including in England and Wales). However, those who receive Holy Communion in the hand must consume the sacred host immediately and reverently, and in the presence of the priest or deacon (or minister) and must not walk away with the Sacred Host in the hand. Pope St. John Paul II emphasised this point particularly in the document Redeptionis Sacramentum (n.92): "...special care should be taken to ensure that the host is consumed by the communicant in the presence of the minister, so that no one goes away carrying the Eucharistic species in his hand. If there is a risk of profanation, then Holy Communion should not be given in the hand to the faithful."
