**JUNE IS THE MONTH WHEN WE CONTEMPLATE THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS.** There are several hymns to the Sacred Heart in our Hymnbook, all of which are fine prayers in their own right. They are: All ye who seek a comfort sure; O Sacred Heart, our home lies deep in Thee; Sweet Heart of Jesus, fount of love and mercy; To Christ the Prince of Peace; To Jesus' Heart all burning.

**MEDITATION FOR THE FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY** The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are one because God is love and love is an absolute life-giving force; the unity created by love is a unity greater than a purely physical unity. The Father gives everything to the Son; the Son receives everything from the Father with gratitude; and the Holy Spirit is the fruit of this mutual love of the Father and the Son.... Responding to the love that comes from the Father, the Son gave his own life for us: on the cross God's merciful love reaches its highest expression. And it is on the cross that the Son of God obtains for us participation in eternal life that is communicated to us with the gift of the Holy Spirit. Thus, in the mystery of the cross, the three divine Persons are present: the Father, who gives his Only-Begotten Son for the salvation of the world; the Son, who totally fulfils the Father's plan; the Holy Spirit — poured out by Jesus at the moment of his death — who comes to make us participants in divine life, to transform our existence so that it may be enlivened by divine love. **SAINTS JOHN FISHER AND THOMAS MORE** were two of the earliest martyrs in the Reformation begun by King Henry VIII. Bishop Fisher was an eminent scholar, who was instrumental in much improvement in the University of Cambridge, where he became Chancellor, the highest office. He was then appointed Bishop of Rochester, while still having heavy responsibility at the University. St. Thomas More was a statesman who was appointed by the King to the supreme post of Lord Chancellor, roughly equivalent to our Prime Minister, plus several other important responsibilities: he was very close to the King in every way. But both John Fisher and Thomas More were executed by Henry because they refused to accept him as the Head of the Church in England: that was the Pope alone. On the scaffold St. Thomas told the crowd that he died in the Faith of the Holy Catholic CHURCH "the King's good servant, but God's first". A prayer of St. Thomas More: *Good Lord, give me grace so to spend my life that when the day of my death shall come, though I may feel pain in my body, I may feel comfort in my soul: and with faithful hope of Thy Mercy, with due love toward Thee, and charity towards the world, I may through Thy Grace, part hence in Thy Glory. AMEN.*
